PUBLIC SPACES

"Triangular" Park

The GBRA Board has been working with Councillor Fragedakis and her team to improve the small park located at the northeast corner of Governors Road and Douglas Crescent. Councillor Fragedakis is working with Parks and Recreation and the Partnerships Office to improve and rename the park - with key input from all Governors Bridge residents.

Orphan Property at Bayview & Nesbitt

This property, on the northwest corner of Bayview is owned by Metrolinx. Being the eastern gateway to our neighbourhood, the GBRA has been working with limited success to get the weeds cut down and the property cleaned up.

The Board is now working with Councillor Fragedakis to look for ways to get Metrolinx to transfer this orphan property to the City of Toronto so it can be landscaped and properly looked after - like our parks and rotary are.

In the short term, the Board is getting a cost analysis of what it would cost to do an initial clean-up of this property - which will be presented to Metrolinx to act upon.

Chorley Park Trial Construction

In case you haven't noticed, the City has cleared vegetation and erected fencing to prepare for construction of the main trail down the slope. Construction of the natural surface trail on the south side of the site is planned for 2018-2019.

Don River Valley Park

Thanks to Evergreen and the City of Toronto, The Don River Valley Park Art Program features new temporary sculptural installations, murals, billboards and performance, including dance and sound, along the Don River, created specifically for this site by local, Canadian and international artists. The first artwork, a series of concrete gargoyle sculptures by acclaimed Omaskêko Cree artist Duane Linklater, will be unveiled on September 23, 2017. Check it out before the BBQ.

Bike Share in Chorley Park, at Summerhill Market

Bike Share Toronto stands are now located nearby to make travel by bicycle more convenient and easy to enjoy.

Bayview Avenue Functional Study

Scheduled to start in 2017, Councillor Fragedakis has confirmed that City staff are suggesting this important study be deferred to 2019. Recognizing the densification of the Lower Don and on Eglinton, the GBRA Board is working closely with Councillor Fragedakis to find a way so that this all-important study is started in 2017. The Board has established a BAFS sub-committee for this project and to assist with the development of the Don River Valley Park. OTHER MATTERS

Transportation Analysis (Area Traffic Study)

Working with Councillor Fragedakis' office, the GBRA Board is asking the City of Toronto staff to study local traffic and parking and provide solutions for:

- Speeding on Governors Bridge and Nesbitt Drive;
- Lack of stopping on Nesbitt Drive at Douglas Crescent T intersection;
- Lack of stopping on Governors Road at Douglas Crescent T intersection;
- Heavy truck traffic in Governors Bridge.

Bayview Avenue Bus (#28)

The GBRA Board is working with Councillor Fragedakis' office to install a "proper" bus shelter at the northbound stop at Nesbitt and Bayview – to improve safety and comfort for local residents waiting for the bus. To get the new shelter, the TTC must do a land assessment and then link up with City staff to install the bus shelter.

New Private Facebook Group for Governors Bridge Residents

A new private Facebook group will be introduced for GBRA members and residents on September 24th. Both GBRA members and residents will be able to use this site until the end of 2018, at which time it will become a GBRA Members Only site. This Facebook site is being created for neighbors and content will be shared by Governors Bridge neighbors. Terms and conditions to access the Facebook site will be presented to GBRA members and residents when they sign up and are approved to participate.
