Governor's Bridge Improvement Plans

The GBRA is working on a number of important projects on your behalf.

Chorley Park

Many residents in Governor's Bridge were taken aback by the lack of consultation about changes in Chorley Park, to say nothing of the clear-cutting on the hill that many people use to get to the Brickworks. Local residents Kim Barwise and Jeff Manemaayer will be working closely with Councillor Fragedakis, City of Toronto staff and neighbouring resident association representatives to find better options than those currently proposed. Hydro One Midtown project

Several area residents have expressed interest in seeing the property below Bennington Heights School and beside the railway tracks restored in ways that benefit Governor's Bridge residents. Suggestions have included urban gardens below the school, a fenced in dog run, and a better toboggan hill. Kids at Play Signage

Tragically, seven-year old Georgia Walsh died in July after being hit by a minivan while crossing the street at the corner of Millwood Road and McRae Drive. Last year, 40 pedestrians died in traffic collisions in Toronto, almost double 2012's toll of 24. Since July's tragedy, Leaside residents have mounted a very visible lawn sign Kids at Play program. GB residents are planning to bring this signage to our area to encourage drivers to "slow down" – especially around Nesbitt Park.
