PUBLIC SPACES

Improving the “Triangular” Park

The GBRA Board has been working with Councillor Fragedakis and her team to improve the small park located at the northeast corner of Governors Road and Douglas Crescent. Councillor Fragedakis is working with Parks and Recreation and the Partnerships Office to improve and rename the park - with input from all Governors Bridge residents.

Orphan Property at Bayview & Nesbitt

The GBRA Board has been unable to get Metrolinx to cut down the weeds and clean up property on the northwest corner of Bayview.

The Board will continue to encourage Metrolinx to transfer this orphan property to the City of Toronto so it can be properly maintained - like our parks and rotary are.

In the interim, the Board is getting quotes to do an initial clean-up and ongoing maintenance.

Chorley Park Trial Construction

Construction of the switchback trail connecting Chorley Park and the Beltline Trail will be reopened in early summer. The North Rosedale Residents Association will be working with the City of Toronto to rehabilitate the site and replant on September 29th.

Bayview Avenue Functional Study

Despite the best efforts Councillor Fragedakis and the GBRA Board, this important study is still deferred to start in 2019. Given the densification near the Lower Don and on Eglinton, the GBRA Board is investigating the potential of hiring a private consulting firm (acceptable to the City) to conduct the study and sharing the cost among nearby residents’ associations and possibly residents of Governors Bridge.

OTHER IMPORTANT PROJECTS

Your Help Needed on New Community Council Boundaries for the City of Toronto

With the transition to 47 wards, the City of Toronto must establish new boundaries for Community Councils. Come December 1st, Governor's Bridge will be in new Ward 34. The City is seeking public input on the attached Options Paper by 5 pm. by Friday May 25, 2018 at www.toronto.ca/CommunityCouncilBoundaries. New GBRA Private Facebook Group “Governors Bridge Community”

The GBRA's new private Facebook group officially launched on May 7th. A group was created to help you and other Governors Bridge residents connect more easily with other members of the community. All Governors Bridge residents will be able to use this group until September 30, 2019, after which time it will become a GBRA Members Only group. City Proposal to Extend On-Street Permit Parking in East York

In April, 2018, the GBRA advised all Governors Bridge residents that the City is seeking public input on a proposal to extend on-street permit parking to all suitable side streets throughout East York that do not currently have it. The GBRA asked residents to complete the City's online survey to provide direct feedback and to complete two GBRA online surveys to determine what the majority wants. The GBRA will review the results and determine next steps at our upcoming board meeting on June 18th.

Bayview Avenue Bus (#28)

The GBRA Board has been working with Councillor Fragedakis' office to install a bus shelter at the northbound stop at Nesbitt and Bayview – to improve safety and comfort for local residents waiting for the bus. The TTC is expected to install the shelter in May.

Transportation Analysis (Area Traffic Study)

With the help of Councillor Fragedakis' office, last fall the GBRA Board asked the City of Toronto staff to study local traffic and parking and provide solutions for speeding, lack of stopping and heavy truck traffic in Governors Bridge. No word yet on an estimated time frame.

Committee of Adjustment: Application for Minor Variances

The GBRA Board initiated and coordinated an effort between the owner and designer of 26 Governors Road and interested Governors Bridge neighbours to address residents' concerns for the number and extent of variances included in the plans to build a new home there. After an in-person meeting, the applicants redesigned the house and re-submitted the plans to address most of the residents' concerns. A new hearing is scheduled for June 27th.
